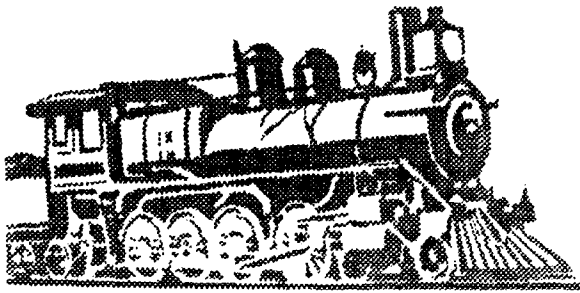


Weather

EJPD and Rotary: Serving one another

East Jordan Police Department investigators now have the means to take more professional evidence photos, thanks to a donation from the East Jordan Rotary.

Every year Rotarians borrow, free of charge, the department garage on Spring Street for their Freedom Festival chicken barbecue. They wanted to acknowledge the generosity with a gift.

"They always help us out this way, even though it is a busy time," noted Rotary treasurer Ed Drenth.

When asked what was needed at the department, Officer Paul Timmons immediately thought of a camera. That's because EJPD investigation technicians Timmons, Bob Christensen and Dan Reese were using Timmons' personal camera to record evidence at crime scenes.

Chief Jerry Alward thought it was an excellent idea. Timmons did the research, then reported a price to the Rotarians, who gave the go-ahead for the \$915 purchase.

The Nikon Auto N50 with a 35-85 mm lens and a special wide-angle zoom lens will make the documentation of evidence at crime scenes an easier job. The wide-angle has the capacity of photographing details from very close range. A flash attachment and automatic light meter complete the package.

"We really appreciate this," said Alward. "We needed it real bad."

And where did the Rotarians get some of the funds that paid for the camera? The chicken barbecue, of course!

Mayor stands mute to charges

East Jordan Mayor Russ Peck waived arraignment on a misdemeanor charge of operating under the influence of liquor in the 90th District Court May 10.

Michigan law provides that a motorist with a blood alcohol level of .10 or more is considered legally drunk.

Peck, represented by attorney Brian Graham of Bellaire, opted to file by mail to stand mute (admit no guilt) on the charges.

Peck was arrested about 2:25 a.m. May 1 in East Jordan by officer Ken Wilson. He was transported to Charlevoix County Jail, where he was released on a \$200 bond at 3:22 p.m.

Peck was directed to appear before Prosecuting Attorney Richard May on May 20 at 11:15 a.m. for a pre-trial hearing.

Jordan Valley Library millage approved

Constituents of the Jordan Valley District Library approved a 1-mill operating levy in elections May 9.

Voter response was 256 for the

millage and 163 against.

"We would like to thank all the people who supported the library throughout this millage campaign," said Dawn Pringle, library director.



Wilson Township man murdered

An elderly man, living alone in a mobile home on Rogers Road in Wilson Township, was found dead Friday afternoon, May 6, according to Charlevoix County Sheriff George Lasater.

Clark Lee Washburn, 81, was found by Deputy Roger Moses after the department was alerted by a county transit

driver that Mr. Washburn would not come to the door.

Washburn died of multiple gunshot wounds, apparently sometime after 3:30 p.m. May 5. An autopsy is being conducted at Blodgett Hospital in Grand Rapids.

No motive has been discovered at this

point in the investigation, according to the sheriff's office. While no evidence indicates the murder is drug-related, Lasater is not ruling out the possibility.

The sheriff's department was assisted at the scene by the state crime lab based in Grayling.

History through the eyes of Aunt Alice

Some East Jordan Girl Scouts recently took a trip back into the history of their hometown, courtesy of the keen memory of Alice Malpass Nesman.

"Aunt Alice," as she is fondly and respectfully known, helped the girls fulfill a requirement toward an honor badge by inviting them into her home, where three generations of the Malpass family were born and raised.

Aunt Alice was a member of that first generation, daughter of East Jordan Iron Works founder William Ellis Malpass and his wife Alice Round Malpass. There were 13 children in the family and Aunt Alice was third from youngest.

Aunt Alice, a retired elementary teacher, is an artist, writer and historian. She wrote an account of the women who pioneered the East Jordan area, because, as she said, the men were written about already.

"I'm 90 years old, so I ought to know something!" Aunt Alice smiled.

She led the four girls; Misty Calloway, Tina Downton, Suzie Malpass and Cynthia Mazzella, as well as their troop leader Barbara Malpass, into a long ago world when stumps still adorned Main Street and there was a community cow pasture just beyond the school grounds.

The village where Alice Round Malpass was raising her children to be good Christians was actually pretty rowdy in those days. Because the area was still dominated by lumbering, there were 13 saloons. On Saturday afternoon, when the workers were paid, mothers kept their children indoors.

"Those lumberjacks raised the dickens up and down Main Street all night long," chuckled Aunt Alice.

By the time Alice was born, the foundry (established in 1883) was doing very well and the Malpass family had moved into their third home. It was a brick home, very spacious for the time, but no indoor plumbing.

"Our outhouse was a three-holer," Aunt Alice told the girls, eliciting lots of giggles. She explained that the holes were three different sizes to accommodate people large to small. Ashes from the stoves were dumped in the outhouses.

"But mosquitos and flies would still bite you when you were in there," Aunt Alice told the girls. There were no bugs in winter, but the problem of cold forced the use of chamber pots and the specialized chores surrounding them.

Aunt Alice gave the girls a memory picture of the

lives of 12-year old girls in her day.

"All the girls learned to sew their own clothes," she said. Girls often took the family cow down to the meadow every day before school and brought her home in the evening. Many folks in town had a cow, "because you couldn't buy milk."

Aunt Alice had to pick berries in season.

"I hated that chore," she said, shaking her head.

Boys also had many chores, including splitting wood and filling the wood boxes before going to school.

Because they were fairly well-to-do and she always had a baby to care for, Alice Round Malpass sent all her laundry out to be done, lighted rooms with kerosene lamps, and had an icebox in the kitchen.

But having above-average income didn't make it any easier to "wade" through the snow (no snowplows), keep out of the mud (no paved streets or sidewalks), or keep the children away from germs that often brought killer epidemics (no hospitals and few doctors.)

Somehow, she kept all her 13 children alive to adulthood. Aunt Alice explained that whenever a child became ill, they were kept completely isolated, with only Mother in the room. Meals taken on a tray would be left outside the sick-room with dishes and linens boiled after use. Then Mother would roll a paper and blow sulphur down any sore throats.

"It seemed to always cure us," said Aunt Alice. "Mother was very careful."

Christmas was the only time people got fresh produce that they didn't grow themselves. Aunt Alice said because railroads had no refrigerator cars, the oranges they got were often old, dried or moldy.

"But we ate them anyway - we thought it was a great treat."

Christmas Eve was a community church celebration with Santa Claus and every child singing or reading. Aunt Alice watched the Ladies Aid make hundreds of little stockings.

"The church ordered bushels of hard candy to fill them with," she said. "Every child would get one. Many came to church just once a year, and for some it was probably the only candy or present they would get in a year."

She showed off her hat collection to the girls, who delighted in trying on several different old-time hats.

"A lady wouldn't be caught dead in church without a hat," said Aunt Alice, noting that East Jordan supported five millinery shops at one time. "Everybody thought they had to have a new hat for Easter Sunday."

Her assortment of collections, arts and crafts prove Aunt Alice has followed her own philosophy, taken from the Bible, "Use your talents. If you don't they'll be taken away."

The young ladies nodded with sincerity and took her words to heart, thanking her for her graciousness.

"I learned a lot I never knew before," said Suzie, who through Aunt Alice's brother William, inherits the Malpass legacy.

The girls all agreed that Aunt Alice made history come alive for them.

"I couldn't imagine East Jordan the way it was then," said Misty. "It was fun."

And Aunt Alice, willing to share so much, had more words of wisdom.

"You can learn so much from so many places," said the lady, and she should know!

The Devil Knows You're Dead By Lawrence Block

Can't imagine why I've not discovered Block before this, because he ranks at the top of the crime fiction genre.

He certainly knows New York City, his town and the setting for his novels.

In Matthew Scudder, P.I. and ex-employee of the NYPD, Block has created a compelling character, immensely human and compassionate, in a profession that rarely lends itself to a fine sensibility.

Scudder is a frequent and regular participant in AA meetings and Block's familiarity with the disease of alcoholism suggests a personal and up-

close relationship. Block writes with style and wit. His characters are unglamorous and believable.

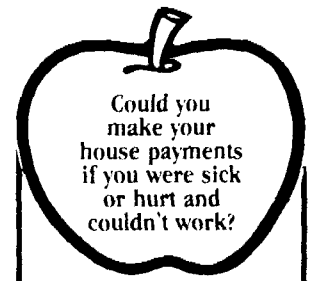
In this book, a yuppie lawyer is killed while making a call from a pay phone in a neighborhood not normally associated with his lifestyle or profession.

A street "crazy" is nailed for the crime and there is no evidence to pursue the case further. Matt is approached by the accused's brother, who believes the police have the wrong man. Aware that the best way to get a suspect off the hook is to find the real perpetrator, Matthew begins with the victim himself.

What he finds contradicts the impeccable character assigned the decedent by the police.

Matthew Scudder is no saint, but you'll find yourself liking him, warts and all. This book may be found at the Central Lake Township Library.

The meeting is free of charge. Refreshments will be served. Reservations not required.

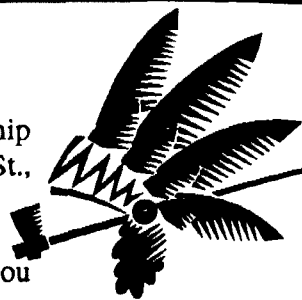

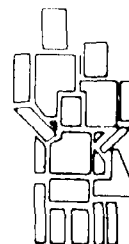

Bellaire scored 92, Central Lake was second with 37, TC St. Francis third with 22, Pellston fourth at 18, with Forest Area fifth.

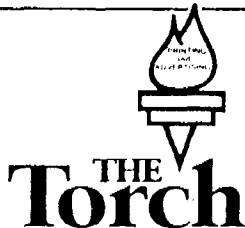

PUBLIC NOTICE**SNOWPLOWING SERVICE - UNIMPROVED COUNTY ROADS**

Because of limitations imposed by narrowness, trees, stumps, steep grades and soft surfaces, the Antrim County Road Commission is unable to provide snowplowing service on unimproved county roads. In order to provide such service, the unimproved road must be improved (including gravel surfacing) to minimum plowing standards.

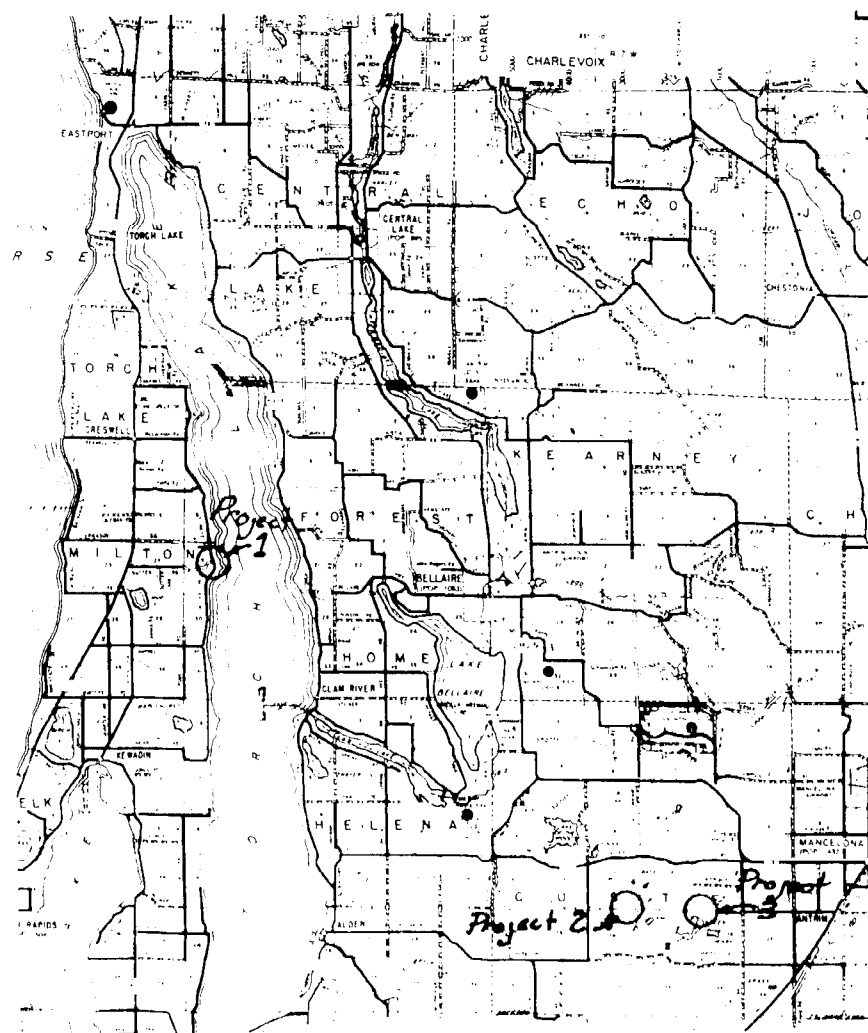
The following procedure is established to provide for such road improvement to allow county snowplowing:

1. Person requesting improvement apply to the township board in the township where the road is located.
2. Township board requests the road commission to inspect the road and jointly determine if the improvement is justified. If the improvement is approved, the road commission will submit an estimate of the cost of the necessary improvement.
3. Upon approval of the project the road commission will agree to pay for 1/3 of its costs. The remaining 2/3 of the cost must be met by others, such as the township, the person requesting the service or other interested parties.
4. The road commission will schedule the work to be done. The person requesting the improvement shall deposit his share of the estimated cost with the road commission before the work is started. The township may authorize their participation in the work by resolution.

The above procedure is a restatement of existing road commission policy adopted on January 18, 1973. Persons living on or considering living on unimproved county roads are herewith advised of the necessary procedure for having such roads improved for wintertime plowing.

The above policy was adopted at the regular meeting of the Antrim County Road Commission on March 14, 1988.

BANKS TOWNSHIP HAZARDOUS SPILLS EXPENSE RECOVERY ORDINANCE

Effective Date: April 18, 1994

Adopted: April 18, 1994

The following is a summary of the ordinance. Full text is posted at the Banks Township Hall Office.

Sec. 1. INTENT: The expense incurred by the taxpayer as a result of Banks Township personnel having to respond when there has been a release of hazardous materials should be recovered from the person responsible for the emergency.

Sec. 2. DEFINITIONS

Sec. 3. NOTICE & RESPONSE: a) Any person who has damaged the surface waters, groundwater, soils or atmosphere by the handling or storage of hazardous materials, or who have violated any environmental laws are required to immediately notify the Antrim County Sheriff Department. b) The requirements of this ordinance shall not be construed to forbid or forgive any person from using all diligence necessary to control a hazardous material release prior or subsequent to the notification of the Sheriff Dept., especially if such efforts may result in the containment of the release or the abatement of extreme hazard to the employees or the general public. Delays in reporting releases due to in-house notification of off-site owners or supervisors shall result in penalties.

Sec. 4. LIABILITY FOR COSTS: Any person causing or contributing to the causing of a release or threatened release shall be liable to the Township for the recoverable costs.

Sec. 5. RECOVERY OF COSTS: The Northwestern Regional Hazardous Materials Response Team or its Designee shall keep an itemized record of recoverable costs resulting from a release or threatened release including an emergency action.

Sec. 6. CIVIL SUIT

Sec. 7. CONFLICT WITH STATE OR FEDERAL LAW

Sec. 8. NON-EXCLUSIVE REMEDY

Mr. Donaldson updated the Council on various projects being worked on in the Village, such as the Park Restrooms, the problems with the sewer system, and a meeting he attended on the 911 system to go into effect soon.

One building permit has been issued the past month in the Village.

A motion made by Pletcher, supported by Guild to pay the bills in the amount of \$40,684.08. Motion carried.

A motion made by Smith, supported by Guild to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 p.m. Motion carried.

The next meeting will be held Monday, June 13, 1994 at 7:00 p.m. at the Governmental Center.

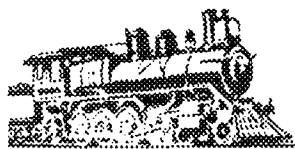
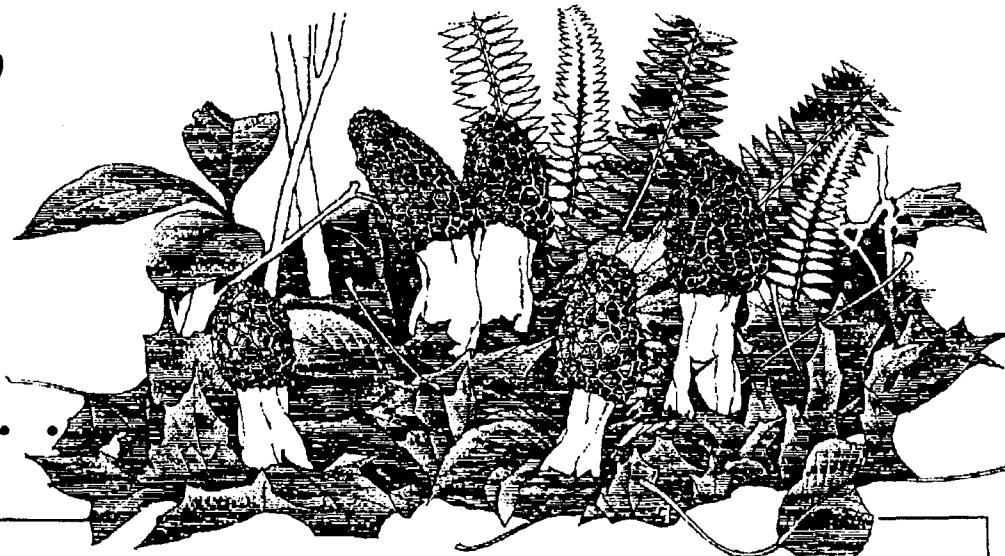

The Frey Foundation makes grants to nonprofit organizations which focus on projects which protect natural resources, enhance the lives of children, youth and families, and strengthen the non-profit sector. The foundation's geographic focus is primarily Kent, Emmet and Charlevoix counties.
